

Cutting Edges in Conflict Transformation Research

Critically discuss and rethink new empirical evidence on the mitigation and avoidance of social conflicts.

How can safe social spaces for sharing memories about social conflicts be broadened beyond private interpersonal communication to unfold empowering impacts on local communities? What is the role of natural resources in fueling sentiments of ethnic inequality? How can gender function as a resource in peacebuilding? Since 2014, three international research consortia are working in 12 countries to address these and other pertinent questions. They take into account the perspectives and perceptions of various players, and find thereby new insights and ideas on how to go about these issues.

Explorations of the body of knowledge

On the occasion of the r4d Forum 2016 Social Conflicts, the r4d programme invites representatives from policy and practice working in the field of social conflicts to discuss new results and insights at the edges of the body of knowledge on conflict transformation and resilience, together with the three research consortia. The participants will explore and rethink the projects' contributions to alternative ways of thinking, analysing and approaching their topics.
